I started playing tennis at primary school when I was 6 and never looked back. This led to 12 years of training, representing Bucks (juniors and seniors) and competing all over the country on the junior circuit. At university I studied Sports Coaching and Performance, and began my post playing career in tennis after I graduated. I am an LTA

Senior Performance Coach, and an R2 graded Referee.

I have coached at venues with different set-ups, ranging from local village 3 court clubs to High Performance Centres with 10+ courts. Each role being unique with its own set of challenges.

Over time, my career has evolved, and I now focus on running competitions (from beginner to international level) and providing administrative and statistical support to the coaching team at Bradfield. I also coordinate the performance programme for Berkshire tennis, assist with some of the Berkshire girls County Cup squads/teams, and tutor Referee courses for the LTA.
